当財団の昨年度の研究論文2篇を発表した Journal of Disaster Research Vol.17 (2022) No.3 (Apr), Special issue on Migration, Dignity, Fragility, and Pandemics のローンチイベントとして開催。日米6団体が共催した。
- 実施内容：
主催者からの挨拶の後、中山幹康専務理事が、Special issue の内容を紹介した。続いて Special issue に論文を発表した著者7名（坂本晶子事務局長を含む）が、昼食を挟んで各々プレゼンテーションを行った。その後、Center for Pacific Islands Studies の Mawyer 教授が司会を務め、「尊厳ある移住」をテーマに、ハワイ大学の学生を中心とした参加者も交え、幅広い議論が行われた。当財団は、気候変動による海面上昇のリスクに直面する島嶼国の国民には、移住だけではなく「残る権利」もあることを指摘し、人工島の建設など、大規模インフラ建設による適応策を提案した。
